


• 3 interwoven lines of effort:

- Conduct an **environmental scan** including inventorying & synthesis of existing DoD alcohol use focused programs & of national & DoD clinical practice guidelines across the FASD care continuum.
- Adopt a community needs assessment methodology using qualitative methods to understand the lived experiences and needs of patients, caregivers & diverse inter-professional providers in the MHS with respect to prevention & early diagnosis across the FASD care continuum.
- Apply **modeling & predictive analytic** methods to the MDR to rigorously examine population health outcomes & risk factors across the FASD continuum of care with the goal of identifying individuals who may benefit from further scheening.


